Emergency Department Expansion Update

Grace Cottage's Emergency Department Expansion project is scheduled to begin in October. The project will be phased in such a way that the Emergency Department will remain

open throughout construction, to be completed by midwinter. Fundraising began in 2021 and will continue until the project has been fully funded.



TeleEmergency Services at Grace Cottage

The recent addition of TeleEmergency services in Grace Cottage's Emergency Department, thanks to a new partnership with Dartmouth Health Connected Care, is being welcomed by our



Emergency Department providers. "We 'went live' with this service on August 11," said Dr. George Terwilliger, Chief Medical Officer, "and the very next day, the TeleEmergency providers at Dartmouth Health helped us save the life of a patient in our Emergency Department. "Following stabilization, the patient required immediate surgery and the transfer to Dartmouth was seamless because we'd already been working together on this patient, via two-way video communication in our ER."

Sara Nystrom, a registered nurse in Grace Cottage's Emergency Department agrees. "I was impressed and amazed at how helpful it was, especially in this case, to have an emergency physician and nurses at a tertiary care facility, Dartmouth Health, practically in the room with us."

Board-certified Emergency Physicians at Dartmouth are now on-call 24/7 with immediate links to provide collaborative back-up and/or direct patient care if Grace Cottage has several simultaneous ER cases, and they can also help with documentation, providing second opinions, and help to facilitate transfers to a higher level of care, if needed.

"While Grace Cottage continues to remain independent, this collaboration with Dartmouth Health Connected Care enables us to enhance our already-stellar team of Emergency Department providers," said Doug DiVello, President and CEO.

A Word From the CEO

I'd been a hospital CEO for decades before I came to Grace Cottage in 2018. What attracted me was Grace Cottage's strong culture of always putting patient care ahead of finances; the organization's strong spirit of independence; and the fact that Grace Cottage receives so much generous support from the community it serves.

Now that I've been here for more than four years, I think it's safe to say that all of the things that attracted me to Grace Cottage are stronger now than ever. We're firing on all cylinders. "Your doctor in the clinic diagnosed my Lyme disease and got me treatment right away!" "Your pharmacy is the best – everyone there knows me by name and treats me like a good friend!"

One of our physicians said it best: "Grace Cottage isn't just part of the community, Grace Cottage IS the community." I really feel this, especially at an event such as Hospital Fair Day, when almost 200 volunteers come together to donate a total of over 2,300 hours to raise money for their beloved, independent, non-profit community hospital. thanks to our loyal, dedicated, and hard-working employees, and our generous community. I'm convinced that, despite the issues we face, including insufficient Medicaid and Medicare reimbursements, inflation, supplychain issues, and lack of housing in the area, that Grace Cottage

Webinars Help LGBTQ+ Vermonters Access Health Insurance

Grace Cottage Family Health & Hospital held two webinars in August to help members of the LGBTQ+ community learn about health insurance options in Vermont.

The effort was underwritten by a grant from the Vermont Department of Health Access (VHA) through its "Helping Vulnerable Populations Understand Health Insurance Options" program. The Vermont Department of Health found that in 2021, 88% of individuals identifying as lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, genderqueer, nonbinary, or another sexual minority were underinsured, and 5% were uninsured.

Grace Cottage worked with Jake McBride, of Out in the Open, a Brattleboro-based LGBTQ+ organization, to conduct two very successful seminars about health insurance options in Vermont. Tailored specifically for the LGBTQ+ community, the August seminars were created and led by Grace Cottage Resource Advocate Jocelyne Smith, who shared information about subsidies, reduced premiums, and other changes that are making health insurance more affordable for Vermonters.

Audience members were very engaged and gave excellent webinar reviews. VHA was also pleased with the outreach, offering "big kudos" for this effort.

Stratton Foundation Supports 'Reach Out & Read'

Grace Cottage Family Health is now an active "Reach Out & Read" site, which means that children ages 6 months to 5 years old will receive a free book during each well-child visit.

Reach Out and Read is a national nonprofit that champions the positive effects of reading daily and engaging in other language-rich activities with young children. Reading together promotes healthy brain development, furthers language acquisition, and helps families build meaningful bonds.

And, thanks to the Stratton Foundation, Grace Cottage will have plenty of books to give out! Reach Out & Read provides an initial selection of books to distribute, after which each site must cover the cost of its own books. The Stratton Foundation has awarded Grace Cottage a \$2,303 grant to fund at least two years of this program.

Rescue Inc. Opens Vermont EMS Academy

In a move that will greatly benefit residents of the West River Valley, Rescue Inc. has opened VEMSA, Vermont EMS Academy, to bring state-of-the-art emergency medical training to this area.

"We've always wanted to create a place where doctors, nurses, teachers, and first responders can hone and broaden their skills," said Drew Hazelton, Rescue Inc.'s chief of operations. "We will offer CPR courses, for instance, to high school students and teachers, while also providing instruction to practicing medical professionals." The Academy, located in the building next to the Lodge at West River that formerly housed E.G. Zac's restaurant (for those who go way back) is opening this month. 

The Gift of Giving

Back in 2006, longtime Wardsboro resident Gloria Moore let Grace Cottage know that she was leaving a bequest to the hospital. After Gloria died on May 24, 2019, we were notified that, although Gloria and her husband, Roland ("Lanny") had moved to Port Aransas, TX, they hadn't forgotten the care they received at Grace Cottage. Last month, we received \$58,000 from Gloria's estate.



Gloria and Lanny's three children,

Roger, Valerie, and Roland all died during their childhoods, so Gloria and Lanny dedicated themselves to the town of Wardsboro, where they lived from 1974-1999. Gloria owned and operated Gloria Moore Realty, and was the town of Wardsboro's appraiser for many years. Lanny was a builder, woodworker and, over the years, a member of the Wardsboro selectboard and planning commission. Gloria and Lanny were known for their gardens, sheep, and chickens at their home on Route 100 in Wardsboro. They have been greatly missed, but their legacy lives on here at Grace Cottage, as their bequest will help Grace Cottage serve our patients for generations to come.

Earning and Keeping Trust

Grace Cottage Hospital (Carlos G. Otis Health Care Center, Inc.) and Grace Cottage Foundation have both earned a score of 100 out of 100 in Finance & Accountability on Charity Navigator. This rating provides an assessment of a nonprofit's financial health (stability, efficiency and sustainability) and its commitment to governance practices and policies. Grace Cottage has also earned a Silver Seal of Transparency from GuideStar.

Environment, Social & Governance Endowment Fund at Grace Cottage

On the recommendation of Grace Cottage Foundation's Investment Committee, an ESG account has been added to the Endowment portfolio at Wilmington Trust. Also referred to as socially responsible investing, ESG investing focuses on three key non-financial factors: environmental, social, and corporate governance when measuring the sustainability and ethical impact of our investments in this account. Environmental criteria examine how a company safeguards the environment, including policies addressing the issue of climate change. Social criteria consider how the company manages relationships with employees, suppliers, customers, and the communities where it operates.
